Whitikahu Road - closure

The Waikato Regional Council has advised that Whitikahu Road will be closed to all traffic from 13 February until 1 March. At this stage that means that Whitikahu traffic will be diverted along Woodlands/Law Roads as the diversion. That creates a high increase in road users past the school all day. Particularly at the start and end of the day it will present an increased risk. We will put in place some measures to keep our tamariki safe. It will include increased staff presence at peak times and keeping everyone inside the school

Spotlight

You would have received an email from

me as to

me advising that we are moving away from Seesaw as our communication tool to share messages and student learning with you.

The new platform will be Spotlight which is an extension of our Student Management System. On this platform you will be able to see achievement data for your child in real time - rather than wait for a report, advise student absences, communicate with teachers and view work. You will get an email with all the instructions for joining when it goes live. Until then absences can be notified by phone or Skoolloop.

Before and after school care

As notified earlier in the week, Before school care will still be provided but in a slightly different format. I will be supervising the care from 7.30 - 8.15 each morning in Room 7. Bookings are essential so we can keep track of who is in the school. The cost is \$5 per family per day and that covers the cost of bread and spreads. The care provision will be run alongside kickstart breakfast which is sponsored by Sanatarium and Fonterra.

After School care is held in the school hall and is operated by Lisa Blake. Bookings and inquiries can be made directly to Lisa at lisablake18@yahoo.co.nz.

Camps

Whanau with students in the senior areas of the school will be receiving notices about school camps that are coming up. We appreciate this is an expense that confronts families, especially those with multiple students in the school. The average cost of an overnight school camp is \$100 per day per student. This pricing is reflective of the consumer price index (CPI) which determines the price of everything we pay for and factors in transport, accommodation and meals as well as activities and experts to run them safely. We are making grant applications to try and offset this cost. Families can also contact Kerry in the office and arrange a time payment option for school expenses. Children benefit immensely from attending camp, especially early in the year where relationships and connections are made.

Sunhats

The sun is fierce. Sunhats are a requirement for everyone in term 1. We don't want burnt kids.

Swimming

The pool is open and swimming is a big part of the healthPE curriculum. It's not optional learning. Children need to bring their togs to school on swimming days and I have asked teachers to contact families to discuss non-swimming students. We also have the expert services of Mr Roger Drury, a highly experienced swim coach who will have sessions with the children in Term 1 and 4. NZ's drowning statistics are appalling. We have an opportunity to provide skills that save lives. Please encourage your children to embrace the opportunity of school swimming.

Lunches

We are offering Subway lunches on Friday for term 1.

These will need to be ordered online and paid for by 3pm on Wednesdays. If your child is absent on the Friday, you can choose to have it delivered to another sibling to bring home or you can pick it up between 1.30 and 3pm. Unfortunately we can't carry it over to the following week as we have with other orders as we are using an outside business for this service. Lunches can be ordered <u>here</u>.
