From the Principal

Tēnā Koutou Katoa,

Welcome back to our students and staff who were isolated at home last week due to COVID19 being in the school. The majority are back now and getting on with the business of learning. During their absence the rules around isolation changed as the country moved into Phase 3. I shared a flowchart on our social media feed and Seesaw that details our response should a positive case be notified. Essentially children can, and are encouraged to, come to school unless they have Covid-19 or someone in their home

returns a positive test. I have reproduced the flowchart in this newsletter for those that missed it.

There is no requirement to provide evidence of a negative test to us. The 10 days isolation is sufficient for school purposes.

If your child has symptoms please do not send them to school and get them a test as soon as possible.

Pick ups and Drop offs

This is working a lot more smoothly now. Thanks to all for your cooperation in the carpark and for your adherence to wearing masks.

We have had the odd incidence of children being dropped off before 8.15am and others occasionally not being picked up - sometimes until 3.45!.











School ends at Gordonton at 2.50pm. The last bus leaves at around 3.30. After that time we are not able to provide supervision or care for children who are still at school. Staff often have professional

meetings to attend or are required off site. If you believe that you can't uplift your children from school on time, SKIDS runs an excellent after school care programme which I encourage you to use. They have casual rates available. Please contact SKIDS on www.skids.co.nz to enrol or programme manager Crystal on 021914411 or email gordonton@skids.co.nz. They run casual programmes up to 4.30pm.

Tomorrow night all of our staff will be in first aid training straight after school. There will be no available supervision for children from 3pm.
