At midnight on Monday we moved without fanfare into Covid-19 Alert Level 3. Not much changes for many families, however, schools have been authorised to open from tomorrow. Thank you to all who completed the survey around returning and I can report that on the 29th April Gordonton will open with only 5 learners.

Ngakau Pono - Trust, loyalty, honesty and integrity

We have been working hard to ensure that we are prepared to accommodate not only those learners but also to comply with the strict Ministry of Health rules (of which there are many) around school operation.

Here are the basics:

- Only authorised people are to be on site at any time.
- A contact register will be maintained in the office.
- School will operate from 8.45 2.15 Monday to Friday.
- Students can attend only when direct early contact has been made with the school for them to do so, preparation has been made for them and their attendance permission has been confirmed.
- Students randomly dropped off without notice will be sent away until preparations and permissions are complete.
- Students must have their own food and a named drink bottle.
- Parents are not to enter the school unless invited to do so.
- Strict compliance with hygiene and hand washing are in operation and also use of resources.
- Playgrounds are CLOSED
- There is no sharing (outside of family groups) school resources.
- A 1m (inside) and 2m (outside) distancing rule will be enforced at all times.
- Online learning will continue as per the last 5 weeks.
- Students attending will do the same applicable online programme as their peers who
 are at home.

My thanks not only to those staff who have volunteered to come in and facilitate an onsite environment, but all our fabulous staff who have maintained a learning programme and contact with the community over this challenging time. We are truly lucky to have such professional teachers, learning assistants and support staff.


