
Cultural Competence Survey

Just a reminder if you haven't already, to complete the short cultural competence survey that was sent out last week. This is important information for us to pitch our cultural response. We have many different cultures represented in our school and we would love to be able to respond to all of them appropriately to give students a sense of cultural safety and belonging to the Gordonton School community.



Dress code

Despite not being a uniform school we still have a dress code for our students. It was amended last year with input from the Board and Teachers. The vast majority of the time our students











easily meet the dress criteria but on occasions where they don't, a gentle conversation or a reminder home will solve things. Here are the guidelines from the policy as a reminder:

Dress Code Guidelines

1. All students are expected to wear clothing that is age and weather appropriate, safe (including being sunsmart) and functional for all school activities. Clothing should not restrict a student's movement or impede their ability to participate in physical education activities (students may bring a change of clothes for physical education).

- 2. Clothing must contain no objectionable or offensive messages or pictures.
- 3. Tops must cover:

The student's shoulders for sun safety (no less than four fingers width and neckline not more than four fingers below the collar bone);

The student's midriff and undergarments

The student's midriff and undergarments.

- 4. Shorts and trousers should be properly held up with a belt if necessary, to ensure a student's underwear is not visible.
- 5. Skirts and shorts should not be shorter than midthigh.
- 6. Shorts, trousers and skirts must not have any rips or holes that expose or risk exposure of the student's underwear while participating in ordinary school activities.
- 7. Students may not wear hats, hoodies or sunglasses in the classroom.
- 8. All students are required to wear a wide brimmed sun hat outside during terms 1 & 4 for breaks, lunch and outdoor lessons (refer to our Sun Smart policy).
