The Laser Eye Centre is visiting Gordonton School on Monday 3rd of November to offer free short-sightedness (Myopia) screenings. This a simple step that could unlock clearer vision, brighter learning, and greater confidence.


Give your child the gft of seeing their world clearly by signing up at the school office by Monday 27th of October.

Note: This screening identifies signs of short-sightedness but does not replace a full eye exam. We have partnered with the Laser Eye Clinic to offer free Myopia screening. If you think your child might be suffering from myopia (short-sightedness), please get in touch with Tania to register for the free screening.

There is no obligation to stick with the Laser Eye Clinic if the screening shows that your child has myopia. However, they are more than happy to work with you, if you wish to stay with them.
