#### First Aid Training.

Our staff are undertaking a First Aid refresher training tomorrow after school. This is a critical operational skill for our teachers and support staff. We never know what kind of medical situations we will face and being prepared and trained is an audited and vital component.

#### Power cut

Last week we had an unplanned power cut in the school during the school day. This one lasted for just over an hour. We had little information from WEL networks to have an idea of when it would be restored. When the power goes out here, everything stops including water - sewerage and the everyday items. A school can't operate without water for a myriad of health reasons. If power isn't restored or isn't likely to be, then I, together with the Board and Ministry of Education make the decision to close the school. This is not a decision we take lightly as we are well aware of the inconvenience and imposition to families, however Health and safety of the children and staff is the paramount factor. How long is too long before I make that call? There are no benchmarks as it is on a case by case basis and has to be managed expertly. As you know - once you tell a child they can't have a drink of water or use the toilet that is all they want to do!! Let's hope it doesn't ever get to that.

That's about it for this week. I'm off to see Pink in concert on Friday night! My wife Sarah is a huge fan so that means I'm also a huge fan! It's at Eden park. Let's hope the weather holds.

Last week Mrs Rogers took a group of students to visit the Komakorau Stream to look at how the Waikato District Council monitor the health of the stream. Thank you to Whaea Carol who saw it as an opportunity for us to be involved. This only happens once every three years so we were very lucky to be able to attend.

The children learnt about how they catch the fish, put them to sleep so they can measure them and then release. Not all fish get released back into the stream but most of them do. Fish that are pests have longer sleep than the ones that are native. They learnt about the difference between long and short fin eels and got to hold some before they slipped out of their
