Last week you will have received an email to download the @school app from eTap. This will be the app we use for communication and later on reporting to parents.



You can use this app for absences, to check your account to see if you have any money owing and see what your children are doing in class through the blog. As we get more proficient at using it, we will add more features.

We have had some issues with parents being able to see some but not all their children. This is due to names not being exactly the same at enrolment e.g. a parent might have used their first and last name for the first child and their full name, including middle, for their second. The system sees them as 2 different people. We are trying to fix these manually so it might take a little while.


